CATHEDRAL FLOOR PLAN

Traditionally, a cathedral is laid out in the shape of a cross. The lower section or nave (from Latin for ship), along with the transepts (the arms of the cross), is where the congregation sits. The choir sits on either side of the chancel. Despite our common terminology, the sanctuary (from Latin for holy) isn't the full worship space but the area right before the altar. The location of the lectern, from which Scripture is read, and pulpit, used for preaching, may vary.

keep meaning to read. So, welcome to this month's episode of "What's Pastor reading?"

Pastor and People: Making Mutual Ministry Work

This book, though it needs a few updates, is a great resource to review when dwelling on a pastor's relationship with a congregation and the congregation's relationship with the pastor. It starts with the pastor's "Letter of Call", continues with the unique roles a pastor may play, and concludes with a number of tools for discussion. I've had the intention to read this for quite a while, but seemed fitting as we revisit our mission as a congregation and wonder together how we will do God's work together as Pastor and people.

Moby Duck: The True Story of 28,800 Bath Toys Lost at Sea and of the Beachcombers, Oceanographers, Environmentalists, and Fools, Including the Author, Who Went in Search of Them

This title is long enough to basically explain it, but is a book that begins with the story of a container ship that faced a storm in January 1992, causing a container to fall into the ocean releasing thousands of rubber ducks (and other animal toys), and what we've learned since after studying their appearance on distant shores in years to follow. The story and concepts connect well to my other position as Port Chaplain with Seafarers International House and other interests I have in studies of our world's ocean. Plus, the pun of a title fits perfectly for me!

Summoner: The Outcast

This one is my "for fun" book, and is the fourth in a series of books I received as a present recently. These are science fiction/fantasy books that focus on a young adult with magical abilities and a creature companion he can summon. It's a fun read, a good break from reality for a little while, and an invitation into imagination.


