Jerusalem Cross

This complex cross, also called the Crusader's Cross or Fivefold Cross, has several interpretations. The main cross is composed of four tau (T) crosses representing the Old Testament law. The four small Greek crosses symbolize the fulfillment of the law in the gospel. The five crosses together represent the church's mission: to spread the gospel to the four corners of the earth. They're also said to symbolize Christ's five wounds (hands, feet and side).

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Letter from Pastor Hayley

Family is the first unit in society. We learned this from our sociology classes. In our family we learn social skills, such as how to engage others, how to behave, and how to love or how to hate.

In a perfect world, your family home is a place of love; the place where you return after a hard day of work. In reality, however, that is not always the case. There are many families with secrets — maybe not everybody gets along, or maybe there are skeletons in the closet nobody wants to mention. Sometimes there are arguments, disagreements, estrangement, total dysfunction. Sometimes a family gets divided by their political beliefs, ethical values, religions, etc.

Jesus knew that different religious values would separate families and not everybody would be Christians. At the same time, no religion would ever replace Christianity. In that sense, the cost of discipleship is sometimes what causes the separation of a family. This is a sad reality.

This sad reality extends beyond our own little family. If we say our congregation is a small family of faithful people, we know we will not always agree on everything every time. If we say we are part of a larger family, our society or perhaps our country, we know there will still be disagreements.

So what can we expect? What is the message we should spread when this happens?

In these current divisive times, the good news we have in Christ is that it's not only through your blood related family that you can receive love and care, but others can be your loving family too. We know not all families are related by blood. Perhaps you were adopted. Some of us have friends who we treasure just as if they were family. There are many ways to be a family.

So in that sense, we are all children of God who received the same Spirit through our baptism. We are a family in Christ who share the same beliefs, the same care for others. We are adopted in Christ as brothers and sisters in the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit.

We may disagree. We may argue. We may address the wrongdoings of our brothers and sisters to such an extent that we argue. Arguments can cause separation or the end of a relationship. However, in God we have the gift of having a relationship with God and with each other. Therefore, we can stand for our brothers and sisters who are mistreated, those who have experienced isolation and loneliness.


